The GEA reduced aid to LI school districts by \$290 million this year...LI schools will receive less state aid in 2013-14 than they received in 2008-09 (\$2.54 billion vs. \$2.62 billion) •Disseminate and make available resources, information, and updates through various media, including website, e-mail blasts, affiliation with PTAs, automated phone messages, and marquees
